
Vice President for Enrollment Management



About Xavier




- Location: New Orleans, LA

Civic Engagement Living Learning Community

Housed: St. Martin Deporres Hall Est. August 2021 Total Participants: 17 Total originally enrolled: 121 Upperclassmen only

DESCRIPTION: This new Living Learning Community is designed to facilitate a collaborative environment where students can further develop their civic identity. Each student will be trained and empowered to identify systemic inequality and actively participate in creating societal change. Students will attend four "Civic Sessions" a semester, and will gain organizing experience through site-visits, mentorship, guest speakers, and community projects.

First Generation Living Learning Community

Housed: Living Learning Center & St. Michaels Residence Hall Est. August 2020 Total Participants: 85 Total originally enrolled: 120

PROGRAMS: Programs included: Financial Literacy, Effective study tips, Navigating Campus, Study Hall , Mondays & Tuesdays during midterms and finals from 6:30 PM to 8 PM

WHAT'S TO COME: 4 programs each semester catered to social & academic adjustment to college, Mandatory study hall every tuesday from 6pm to 8pm, 2, 1 on 1 sessions with Ms. Christy to do a mental health check in, if restrictions ease, 2 large programs that include theater shows and museums.
