PROBLEM







- Public Schools were initially designed for elite white males. Boston Latin was the first and only school in America. First white female to attend in 1859 Boston Latin was of privilege, named Helen Magill White. Her father was the Vice Principal of the school.
- 1835 the Abiel Smith School served as an African American segregated school in Boston.
- Jesse Buttrick Davis is the 1st Professional School Counselor in the United States who implemented a systematic guidance program in the schools. He was one of the founders of the National Vocational Guidance Association (now National Career Development Association NCDA) and National Association of Secondary School Principals.

Inadequate Career Counseling

INADEQUATE CAREER COUNSELING



During COVID/ After COVID

- school counselors and career services practitioners were less likely to schedule appointments (during/after)
- recommended student to school counselor ratio by the American Counseling Association say 250 to 1; but national average is 430 to 1. Some places 1100 to 1.
- unable to provide remote appointments; (1) computer access,
 (2) Internet access.
- STRADA-GALLUP 2018 22% students utilize their career center, however 33% preferred to ask faculty for career services.



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Dynamics of Counseling



 The national average for grades K-8 ranges from 613:1 to 787:1. The national average for grades 9-12 ranges from 204:1 to 243:1.

• Create ways for planting a seed for enhancing career aspirations for students (example: career fairs)

Cultural & Social Illiteracy

- Multicultural approach to meet the needs of all members of the community. (2-way approach)
- Community Interest Survey, American Community Survey, or Meetings with community groups to discover: generational shift and providing a voice (baby boomers, gen-z, gen-x, millennials). Each month, *3,5 million people receive an ACS survey
- Building Relationships Parents, community groups, faithbased organizations.

- White, 67.0%
- Hispanic or Latino, 14.2%
- Black or African American, 10.6%
- Unknown, 3.8%
- Asian**, 3.7%**
- American Indian and Alaska Native, 0.7%
- o 59.3% Women
- o 40.7% Men
- 11% LGBT

FACT: 70% of the Teachers in public schools are white.





DEMOGRAPHICS – K-12



Racial breakdown of the student population in American public schools, as of 2021:

- White students: 45.2%
- Hispanic students: 28.4%
- Black students: 14.9%
- Asian students: 5.4%
- Two or more race students: 4.7%
- American Indian/Alaska Native students: 0.9%
- Pacific Islander students: 0.4%
 Note: Percentages do not total 100 because of rounding.




