Sections B through F provide a compilation of interrelated information gleaned from student responses across the multiple components of the SYSA, including academic and social motivation, general coping skills, student needs and interests, and institutional impressions. Each section combines relevant items and scales from each SYSA component to inform a single area of documented challenge for second-year students—academics, advising, leadership, transition, and finances. Together, these sections provide a comprehensive overview of second-year students' current college experiences at both the campus and national levels. The national comparison group for the campus is based on institutional type—four-year private, four-year public, or two-year.
