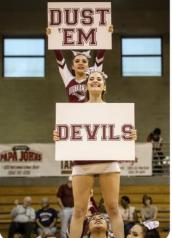

#### **Why This Matters**

#### The case for Student Development



55% of enrollment offices report staff shortages (AACRAO, 2023 State of the Profession Report)



1 in 3 higher-ed professionals (one-third) say they plan to leave the field within the next 5 years. (CUPA – HR Higher Ed Workforce Survey, 2023)



37% of student employees have access to formal mentorship as student employees. (NACE, 2022 Internship & Co-op Survey)

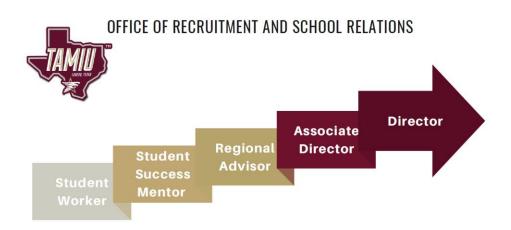


Students engaging in strategic and leadership tasks are twice as likely to pursue a career within high education. (NASPA, 2021 Student Affairs Professional Pipeline report.)

#### **The case for Student Development**

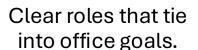
- Enhance Student Engagement and Retention

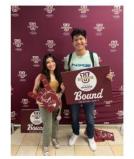
