

## Sample Supplemental Questions – Retention Management System Plus™

- Retention Data Center<sup>™</sup> allows colleagues who administer their inventories online to ask supplemental, campus-defined questions. The answers to these questions are viewed on the Advisor/Counselor Reports and the Coordinator Reports. Responses can also be exported electronically from the data center for further review.
- Questions display at the end of the survey in the order they were created. The questions appear in multiple choice format allowing the student to select only one answer per question. Many of our sample questions below could be answered with Yes/No/Maybe, Strongly Agree/Agree/Indifferent/Disagree/Strongly Disagree, or even on the 1 to 7 rating scale featured on the inventory, by inserting the words that represent the numbers on the scale.
- Please note that while we have loosely grouped these sample questions into the scales affiliated with the College Student Inventory<sup>™</sup>, these are not exclusively affiliated with those scales nor will they appear alongside the scales in reporting. You do not need to use the questions provided here. However, they are a jumping off point for consideration and discussion as you develop the customized questions for your campus.
- In addition, because of the Covid-19 pandemic, we have worked with a number of clients to develop custom questions specific to the impact of the coronavirus disruption. These are included in the Covid-19 Impact section below.
- As you consider supplemental questions, please avoid the addition of too many, as that may increase survey fatigue. We recommended 5-10 in addition to the inventory's standard items, though you may add as many as you wish.
